Devote Time for Learning at NAAEE Conference in St. Paul

If you want more time to explore environmental education topics in depth, you'll find lots of options at the 35th NAAEE annual conference in St. Paul this coming October.

You can choose from among 17 preconference workshops that begin on Tuesday evening, October 10, and run through Wednesday, October 11. - ***Class Matters: Making EE Organizations and Capacity Building Efforts Inclusive***...Take this opportunity to explore how we can begin to understand social class issues, and thereby effectively address environmental problems that affect all segments of society.
- ***Education for a Sustainable World***...Learn cross-curricular academic standards by reviewing sustainability concepts through fun activities and teaching tools for classrooms.
- ***Designing and Implementing Successful Community Service Learning Projects***...Help kick off the 2007 NAAEE Community Service Project while exploring how to design community-based service learning projects.
- ***Practical Environmental Public Relations and Marketing***...Need practical tools for marketing and public relations your environmental education programs? You'll leave this session with specific ideas to meet your challenges!
